SUMMARY OF KEY EXPORT CONTROLS FOR INTERNATIONAL INTERACTIONS

SIU

Any international involvement, including collaborations, conferences, organizations, or travel, must be cleared by the Export Controls Office **PRIOR** to any interactions.

INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIONS

- Any collaborations with any entities outside of the United States, including individuals, universities, companies, or government entities must be cleared with the Export Controls Office **PRIOR** to the collaboration.
- Collaborations include, but are not limited to, research, writing a publication, being involved in a training, conference, or organization.
- The Export Controls Office will screen the entity to ensure that they are not on a restricted list.

INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

- Individuals must gain approval from the Export Controls Office **PRIOR** to travel to any country outside the United States.
- The Export Controls Office will validate where you are traveling, the purpose of travel, and if you are taking any SIU property with you.

SIU CLEAN LAPTOP PROGRAM

All SIU employees that travel to the designated foreign countries will require that an ITS clean laptop be used during SIU business travel to these countries:

- China Iran
- North Korea Svria
- Cuba • Sudan • Russia
- Ukraine (Crimea
- Region) Venezuela

INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCES

- Individuals must gain approval from the Export Controls Office **PRIOR** to involvement in an international conference.
- Approval is required even if attendance is remote and the participant will not travel to that country.

PENALTIES

- Criminal: Up to \$1,000,000 per violation and 10 years in prison
- Civil: Up to \$500,000 per violation, loss of export privileges, loss of Federal research funding and/or seizure and forfeiture of articles.
