U.S. LIKELY TO LEVY HIGHER <u>PENALTIES FOR EXPORT-</u> <u>CONTROL VIOLATIONS</u>

A top U.S. official said businesses should expect much higher penalties for violations of export controls, the use of which has expanded as the U.S. seeks to curb the ability of Russia and China to obtain certain technology. U.S. penalties for export-control violations could begin to approach the size of those meted out for foreign bribery.

JUSTICE DEPARTMENT ANNOUNCES CHARGES AND ARREST IN TWO SEPARATE ILLICIT TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER SCHEMES

In two separate cases out of U.S. Attorneys' Offices on opposite coasts, several individuals are charged in connection with sophisticated schemes to transfer sensitive technology, goods, and information for the benefit of hostile foreign adversaries, in violation of U.S. law.

AMERICAN SHORT-TERM STUDY IN CHINA INITIATIVE (ASSCI)

The American Short-Term Study in China Initiative (ASSCI) is a scholarship program offered by the Embassy of the People's Republic of China in the United States of America and administered by the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU).

As a reminder, you must contact the Export Controls Office prior to any involvement or collaborations with international entities. Therefore, if you receive an invitation or information from this initiative or any international initiative, you must clear it with the Export Controls Office before responding.

You can find information about <u>Foreign Talent</u> <u>Programs here</u>. However, the regulations are ever changing and evolving. Therefore, while you can use this to gain knowledge, you should still contact the Export Controls Office before any international involvement, even if you don't believe it meets the criteria as a Foreign Talent Program, as there are also further regulations and laws to consider.

"TALENT PROGRAM" FAQS

What is a foreign "TALENTS" program?

Any foreign state sponsored attempt to acquire U.S.-funded scientific research through recruitment programs that target scientists, engineers, academics, researchers, and entrepreneurs of all nationalities working or educated in the United States.

These recruitment programs are often part of broader whole-of-government strategies to reduce costs associated with basic research while focusing investment on military development or dominance in emerging technology sectors. The Department of Energy issued an order on 7 July 2019 with fairly clear explanations of Talents programs <u>DOE O 486.1</u>.

How does this affect SIU and me?

Association with a Talents Program can lead to ineligibility to receive Federal funding for your research. Currently there is no due process to challenge such a determination or limit to the time interval over which it is imposed. Past associations may also be concerning to the US Government.

<u>CHINA DEFENSE</u> <u>UNIVERSITIES TRACKER</u>

The Tracker is a tool created by ASPI's International Cyber Policy Centre to inform universities, governments and scholars as they engage with the entities from the People's Republic of China. It aims to build understanding of the expansion of militarycivil fusion—the Chinese government's policy of integrating military and civilian efforts—into the education sector. The Tracker should be used to inform due diligence of Chinese institutions.
