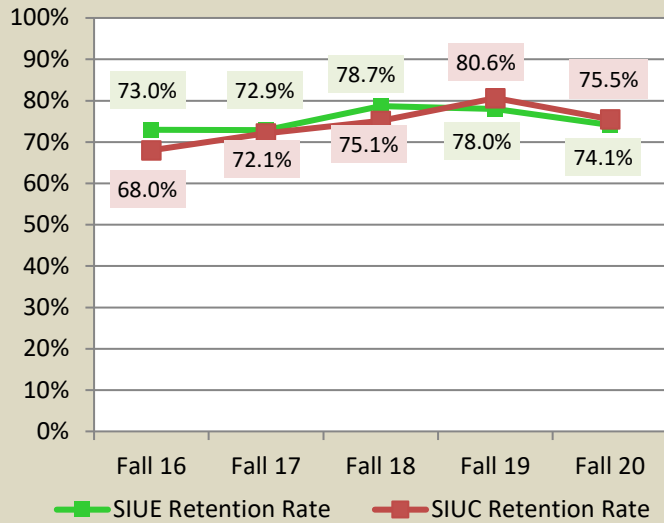

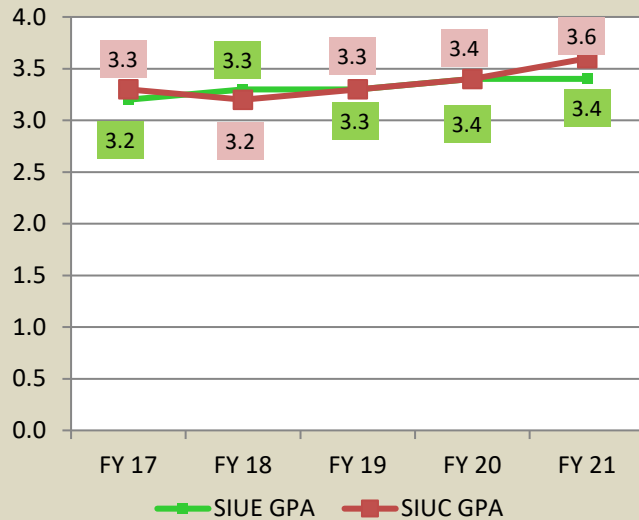
Retention Rate by Campus



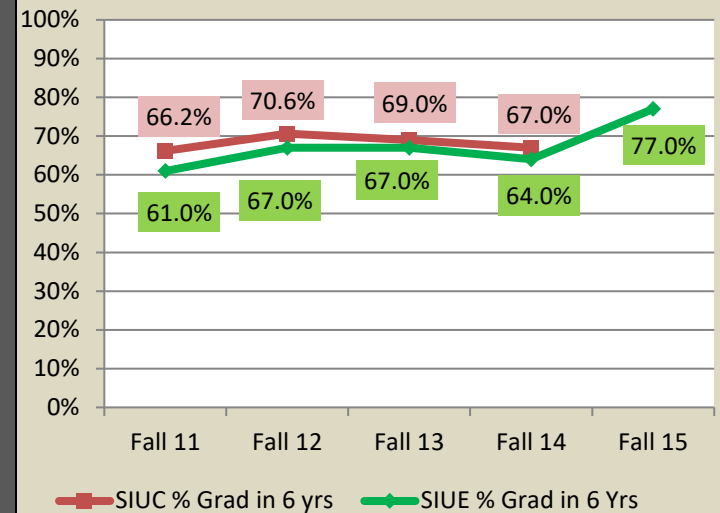
6-Year Graduation Rate by Campus



Overall GPA by Campus



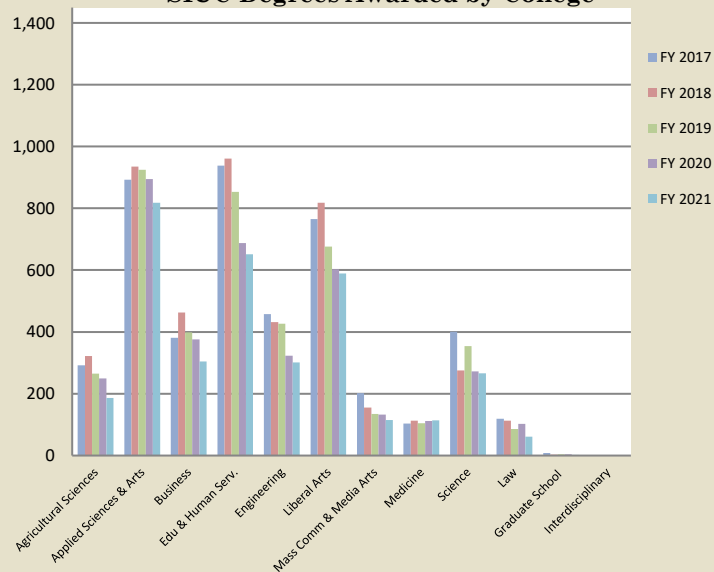
Student Athlete 6-Year Graduation Rate by Campus



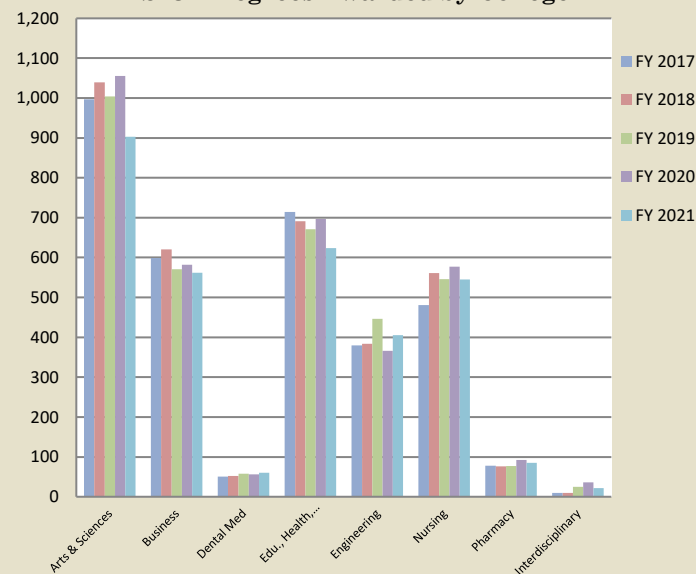

Tenure Track Status



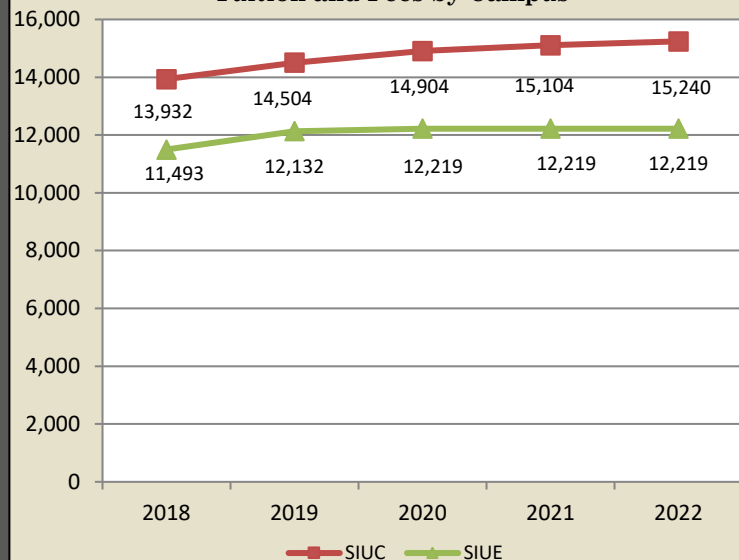

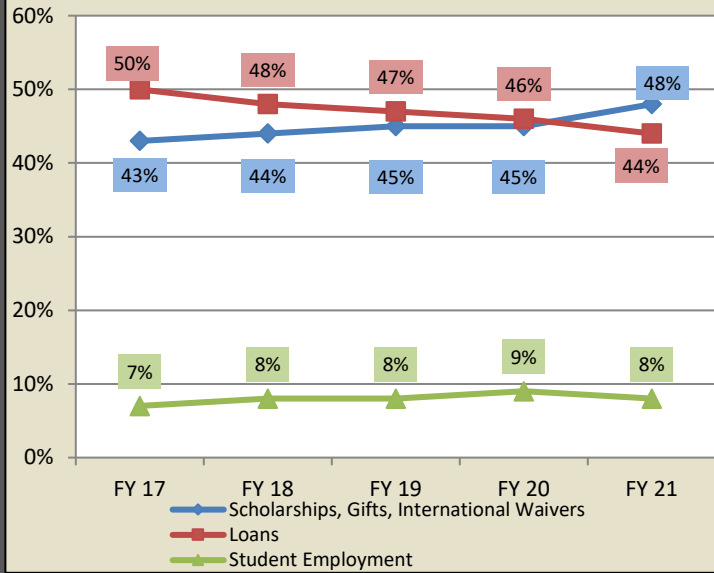


Cost of Attendance by Campus

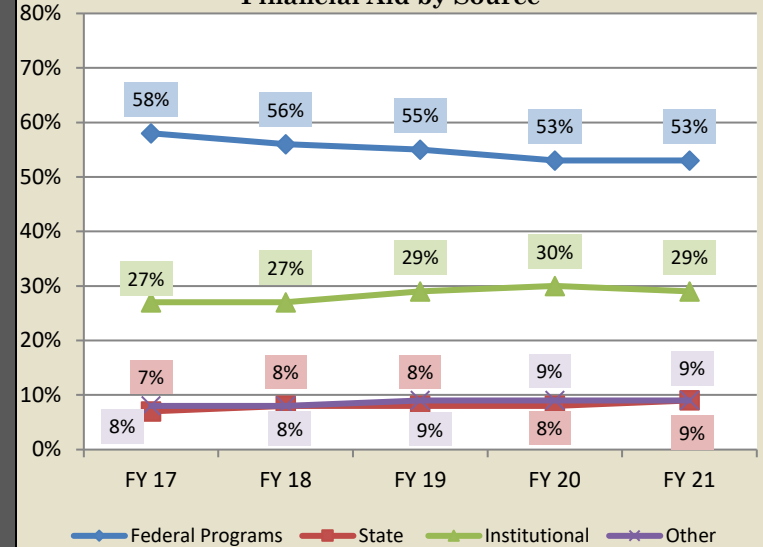

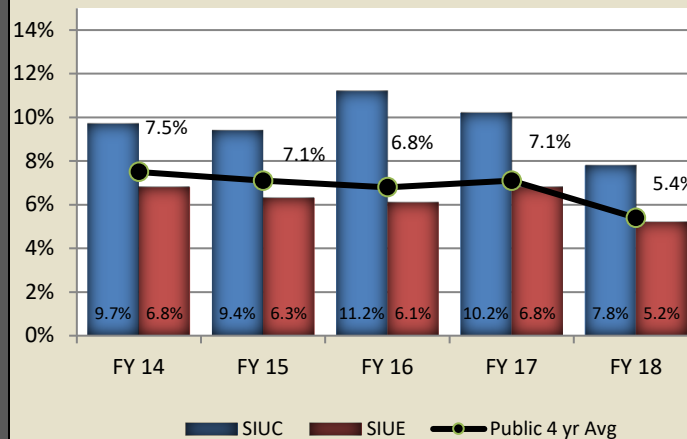
Financial Aid by Type

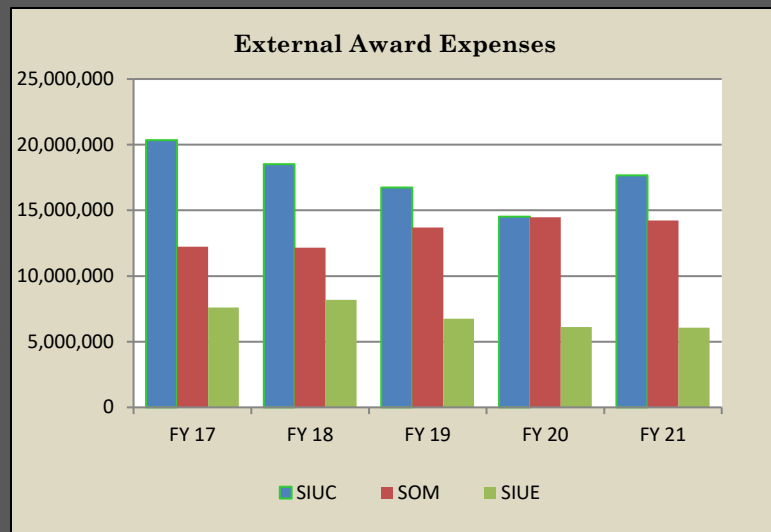


Federal Student Aid 3-Year Default Rates

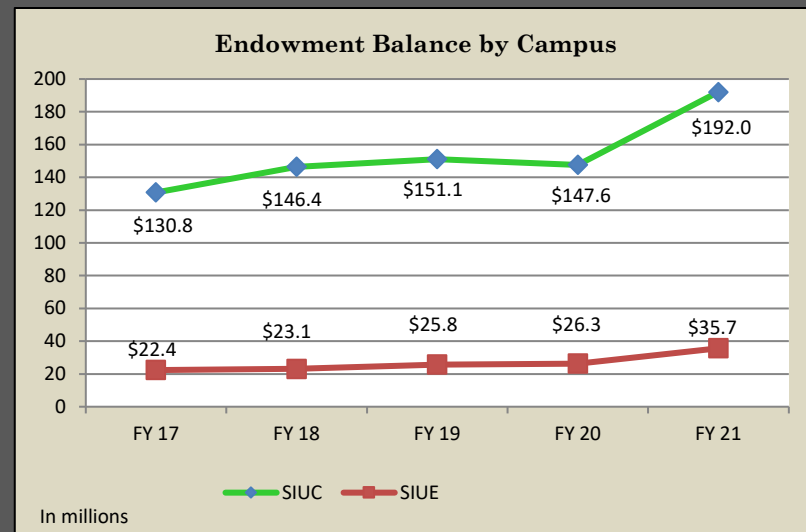

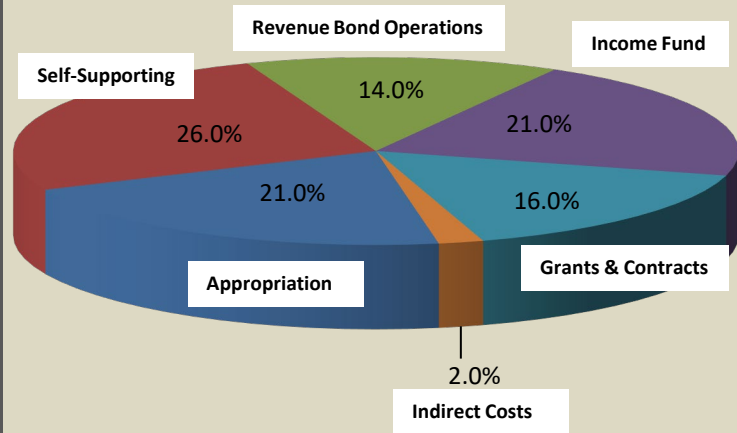

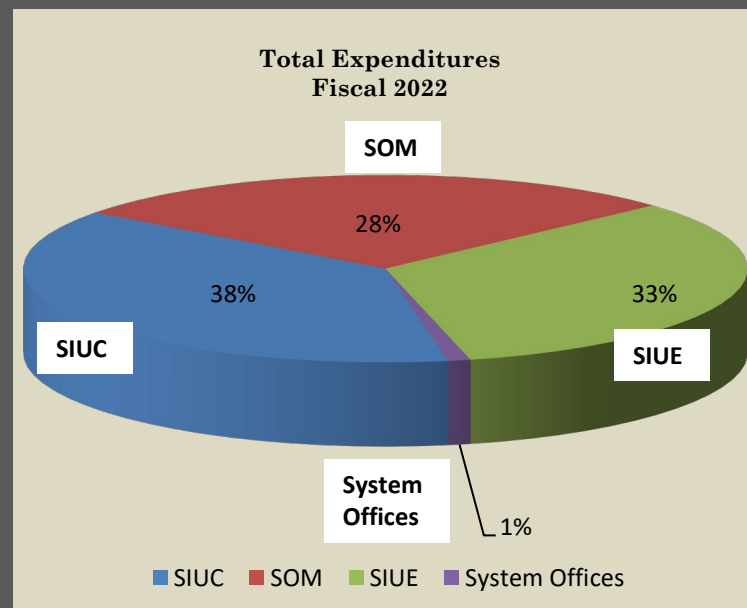
**Total Revenues by Source

Race/Ethnicity	<p>Categories developed in 1997 by the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) that are used to describe groups in which individuals belong, identify with, or belong in the eyes of the community. The categories do not denote scientific definitions of anthropological origins. The designations are used to categorize U.S. citizens, resident aliens, and other eligible non-citizens. Individuals are asked to first designate ethnicity as:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nonresident Alien (International) • Race and Ethnicity Unknown • Hispanic/Latino or • Not Hispanic or Latino <p>Second, individuals are asked to indicate one or more races that apply among the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • American Indian or Alaska Native • Asian • Black or African American • Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander • White <p>If more than one of the above is stated then</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two or More Races 	IPEDS Definition
First-time Freshman	<p>A student who has no prior postsecondary experience (except as noted below) attending any institution for the first time at the undergraduate level. IPEDS	National Center for Education Statistics is authorized by law to “collect, report, analyze, and disseminate statistical data related to education in the United States and in other nations”. They are in charge of the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) surveys which are a group of surveys that are mandatory for all institutions that participate or applicants for participation in any Federal financial assistance program authorized by Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended. The completion of the surveys is mandated by 20 USC 1094, Section 487(a)(17).	IPEDS Collection Website
Minority	Self-reported ethnic designations including Hispanic of any race, American Indian or Alaskan Native, Asian, Black or African American, Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander, and Two or More Races. This category does not include International students.	IPEDS
International Student	A person who is not a citizen or national of the United States and who is in this country on a visa or temporary basis and does not have the right to remain indefinitely.	IPEDS Survey Glossary
