Purpose of Land Acknowledgement Statement

A land acknowledgment is a formal statement that recognizes and respects the original inhabitants of the land. It makes visible the Indigenous communities who experienced death, dispossession, displacement, and trauma. Land Acknowledgement Statements foster greater understanding of land rights and the truth about our history. This Statement serves to raise awareness and celebrate the historic and sustained presence of Native peoples who protected and cared for the land that we benefit from today. It also provides a pathway to strengthen meaningful, sustainable, and reciprocal relationships with Indigenous communities. The SIUS Statement can be made at the beginning of lectures, ceremonies, and public gatherings.

SIUS Land Acknowledgement Statement

The Southern Illinois University System respectfully acknowledges the Indigenous peoples and lands on which our colleges reside.
