U.S. AUTHORITIES SHUT DOWN MAJOR CHINA-LINKED AI TECH SMUGGLING NETWORK

Two businessmen are now in custody for allegedly violating U.S. export control and smuggling laws. As part of the overall investigation, a Houston company and its owner also pleaded guilty to smuggling cutting-edge Artificial Intelligence (AI) technology out of the United States, and the United States has seized over \$50 million in Nvidia technologies and cash.

SANCTIONS AND EXPORT CONTROLS RELIEF FOR SYRIA

The U.S. government has adopted new policies and regulatory posture to encourage U.S. businesses and banks, the international community, the Syrian people, and regional partners to contribute to Syria's stability while denying resources to harmful actors.

INTERNATIONAL SHIPPING

SIU's international shipping must comply with export control laws and regulations, which may require SIU to obtain an export license for shipments of tangible items outside of the U.S. The shipment of items to a foreign country are considered an export even it's temporary, wasn't sold, or will be used for research.

All SIU personnel who engage in international shipping are responsible for ensuring compliance with U.S. export control laws and regulations. Shipping without obtaining the appropriate license or other government approval, or failing to file accurate export or shipping documentation, may result in confiscation of the shipped items, fines and/or other penalties.

The International Shipping guidance can assist you in taking the proper action BEFORE exporting an item. The Export Controls Office can assist you in evaluating if a license is required and if so, in obtaining the license.

FOREIGN TALENT PROGRAM

A foreign talent program is any foreign state sponsored attempt to acquire U.S.-funded scientific research through recruitment programs that target scientists, engineers, academics, researchers, and entrepreneurs of all nationalities working or educated in the United States. The Department of Energy issued an order on 7 July 2019 with fairly clear explanations of Talents programs DOE O 486.1.

Participation in such a program must be disclosed on the FCOI form, as well as any relevant forms related to any federal funding that you may be receiving, and on future federal funding proposals. Association with a Talents Program could potentially lead to ineligibility to receive Federal funding for your research.

MALIGN FOREIGN TALENT RECRUITMENT PROGRAM (MFTRP)

The federal government's definition of a MFTRP or "malign" program includes three main elements: (1) Sponsored by a "country of concern" as defined by the Secretary of State, and currently (as of January 1, 2024) includes China, North Korea, the Russian Federation, and Iran; (2) There is some form compensation or benefit (which does not have to be monetary, including the promise of a future benefit including in-kind contributions or honorary titles); and (3) Includes one of more of the problematic indicators in the federal government's definition of a "malign" talent program.

Participation in a MFTRP is prohibited for researchers applying for or receiving federal funding.
