SHUTDOWN FREEZES EXPORT LICENSING; BIS ENFORCEMENT CONTINUES, DDTC ON ICE

The federal shutdown has left large portions of the Commerce Department shuttered, while the State Department's Directorate of Defense Trade Controls (DDTC) has suspended nearly all licensing activity. The Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS), however, will continue most enforcement and emergency functions.

LATVIAN BROKER PLEADS GUILTY TO CONSPIRING TO ILLEGALLY EXPORT U.S. AIRCRAFT TECHNOLOGY TO RUSSIA

Latvian national, Oleg Chistyakov, aka Olegs Čitsjakovs, 56, pleaded guilty for his role in a years-long conspiracy to circumvent U.S. export laws by filing false export forms with the U.S. government and, after Russia's invasion of Ukraine in February 2022, continuing to procure and sell sophisticated and controlled avionics equipment to customers in Russia without the required licenses from the U.S. Department of Commerce.

INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL REGISTRY REQUIREMENT

At the April 2025 Board of Trustees meeting, the Board approved an International Travel Registration Policy to describe responsibilities of SIU-S and all of its international travelers and established processes to help ensure that legal and safety risks associated with university-related international travel are identified, acknowledged, and managed appropriately.

All Individuals in the SIU-S community traveling abroad as part of SIU-S Related Travel will be required to enter their travel information into the Terra Dotta International Travel Registry thirty (30) days before they depart.

FOREIGN TALENT PROGRAM

A foreign talent program is any foreign state sponsored attempt to acquire U.S.-funded scientific research through recruitment programs that target scientists, engineers, academics, researchers, and entrepreneurs of all nationalities working or educated in the United States. The Department of Energy issued an order on 7 July 2019 with fairly clear explanations of Talents programs DOE O 486.1.

Participation in such a program must be disclosed on the FCOI form, as well as any relevant forms related to any federal funding that you may be receiving, and on future federal funding proposals. Association with a Talents Program could potentially lead to ineligibility to receive Federal funding for your research.

MALIGN FOREIGN TALENT RECRUITMENT PROGRAM (MFTRP)

The federal government's definition of a MFTRP or "malign" program includes three main elements: (1) Sponsored by a "country of concern" as defined by the Secretary of State, and currently (as of January 1, 2024) includes China, North Korea, the Russian Federation, and Iran; (2) There is some form compensation or benefit (which does not have to be monetary, including the promise of a future benefit including in-kind contributions or honorary titles); and (3) Includes one of more of the problematic indicators in the federal government's definition of a "malign" talent program.

Participation in a MFTRP is prohibited for researchers applying for or receiving federal funding.
